TOYS FOR MY KITTY

There are several criteria that can be used in judging a cat toy. Toys should stimulate the senses of hearing, touch, and sight. Many cats enjoy playing with jingle balls, catnip toys, toilet rolls, and milk rings (the ring that comes off of a gallon milk container), all of which can be easily acquired. Giving cats yarn or loose string to play with is dangerous because they can choke on it or ingest it. Cats also enjoy playing with large, crumpled-up pieces of paper or tin foil, but be sure these are big enough so that they won't fit in a cat's mouth. Cats love to play, but choosing the right toy is crucial.
